

Leader: What does the fifth commandment forbid?

People: The fifth commandment forbids the neglecting of, or doing

anything against, the honor and duty which belongs to every

person in their several places and relations.

Leader: Why are those over us referred to as father and mother?

People: The terms father and mother remind those in authority that,

like fathers and mothers, they are responsible for and should act in a loving and tender way, appropriately reflecting their particular relationship, toward those under them; and those under them are also encouraged to accept their authority

more willingly and cheerfully.
