

Leader: Christians, what do we believe?

Call to Confession Romans 13:8-10

Leader: Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

Public Confession

Leader: Let us confess our sins together.

All:

Lord, save us from our sin, and guide us in your ways.
