Leader: What is the sixth commandment?

People: The sixth commandment is: You shall not murder.

Leader: What is God's will for you in the sixth commandment?

People: I am not to belittle, insult, hate, or murder my neighbor – not by my thoughts, my words, my look or gesture, and certainly

not by actual deeds – and I am not to be party to this in others; rather, I am to put away all desire for revenge. I am not to harm or recklessly endanger myself either. Prevention of murder is also why government is armed with the sword.

Leader: Does this commandment refer only to murder?

People: By forbidding murder God teaches us that he hates the root of

murder: envy, anger, vindictiveness. In God's sight all such are

murder.

Leader: Is it enough then that we do not murder our neighbor in any

such way?

People: No. By condemning envy, hatred, and anger God tells us to

love our neighbors as ourselves, to be patient, peace-loving, gentle, merciful, and friendly to them, to protect them from harm as much as we can, and to do good even to our enemies.

Public Confession Leader: Let us confess our sins together.

All: O holy Father, because we are fallen sinful creatures, it

is so easy for us to think only of ourselves and ignore the needs of others. Our sinful natures lead us to selfishness and indifference. Thereby, we murder our brother and sister, and sin against you, our Father. O Lord, we do humbly confess our selfish nature and plead your forgiveness. Give us, we pray, the mind and heart of our Savior who loved the unlovely and redeemed us from destruction. Burden us with the souls of those who are perishing that we may be bold to testify of the saving grace of Jesus Christ. Use us, your people, to gather your elect from the four corners of this world so that your glory may cover the earth as the waters cover the sea. In the mighty name of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen.
