who takes his name in vain. (Exodus 20:7)

Leader: What is required in the third commandment?

People: The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of

God's name, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word, and works.

Leader: What is God's will for us in the third commandment?

People: That we neither blaspheme nor misuse the name of God by cursing, periury, or unnecessary oaths, nor share in such horrible sins by being silent bystanders. In a word, it requires that we use the holy name of God only with reverence and awe, so that we may properly confess him, pray to him, and

praise him in everything we do and say.

Public Confession Leader: Let us confess our sins together.

All: Almighty and everlasting God, who orders all things in

heaven and on earth, and who made all ages a preparation for the coming of your Son, we confess before you that we have sinned. We have not loved you as we ought. We have exercised false priorities; maintained false concepts of God; taken vows we have not kept; failed to honor your Lord's Day. Furthermore, we have not loved one another as we ought. We have failed to give honor to whom it is due; failed to preserve life; failed in maintaining purity of heart; taken what is not ours; borne false witness to make ourselves look better; and we have entertained covetous thoughts. O God, forgive our sins! We are sorry for them. We look to the merit and mediation of our Savior. Jesus Christ, to wash our sins away. Grant that we may grow in true faith and obedience to the honor of your great name. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
